1-TYPES OF COMPETITION

1.1 Competitions of the Boxe Francaise Savate or of Canne de Combat will follow all the Rules and regulations of USA SAVATE the national Governing Body of the sports of Savate in the United States.

2-The division Governing Abilities of the Directors

2.1 The International Guild is divided into the Following:

Technical Director-

Can have advisors for his work or review of future works and techniques of the art of Danse De Rue Savate. Registration of Clubs and members is overseen by the technical director. Has the power to issue any Federal Rank, Technical Rank, Teaching Rank as well as to disbar a member or re-admit a member to the International Guild of Danse De Rue Savate.

Has the ability to redesign the art of Danse De Rue Savate and developed new directors for specific purposes that will be in charge of certain abilities directly under his charge.

The following directors can be appointed by the Technical Directors on the Council of the Left which pertains to the perpetuation of the International Guild of Danse De Rue Savate.

It is an advisory body made of individual committees that are created and assigned for various periods of time determined by the Technical Director.

The personnel of the council of the left consist predominately of volunteers that have been selected by the Technical Director according to the talents that are required for the specific task. The committees exist until particular task is completed.

Committees

Competition: the monitoring of the participants

Weapons: Provides counseling and up to date information, two committees are active

Liaisons: pertains to the planning of events, which work to transmit Danse De Rue Savate into the next categories

- 1) Military
- 2) Law enforcement
- 3) Women's self-defense
- 4) Children's self-defense

Sponsorships: Pertains to the building of support either for the guild or that of charity work

Journal: broken into two groups

- 1) Newsletter the collection of articles from the guild and transmitting them to the office for distribution.
- 2) Internet pertains to modifying and transmitting material o the Guild to others via the net.

Awareness & Presence: pertains to the providing of advice and the service of protection to those in need

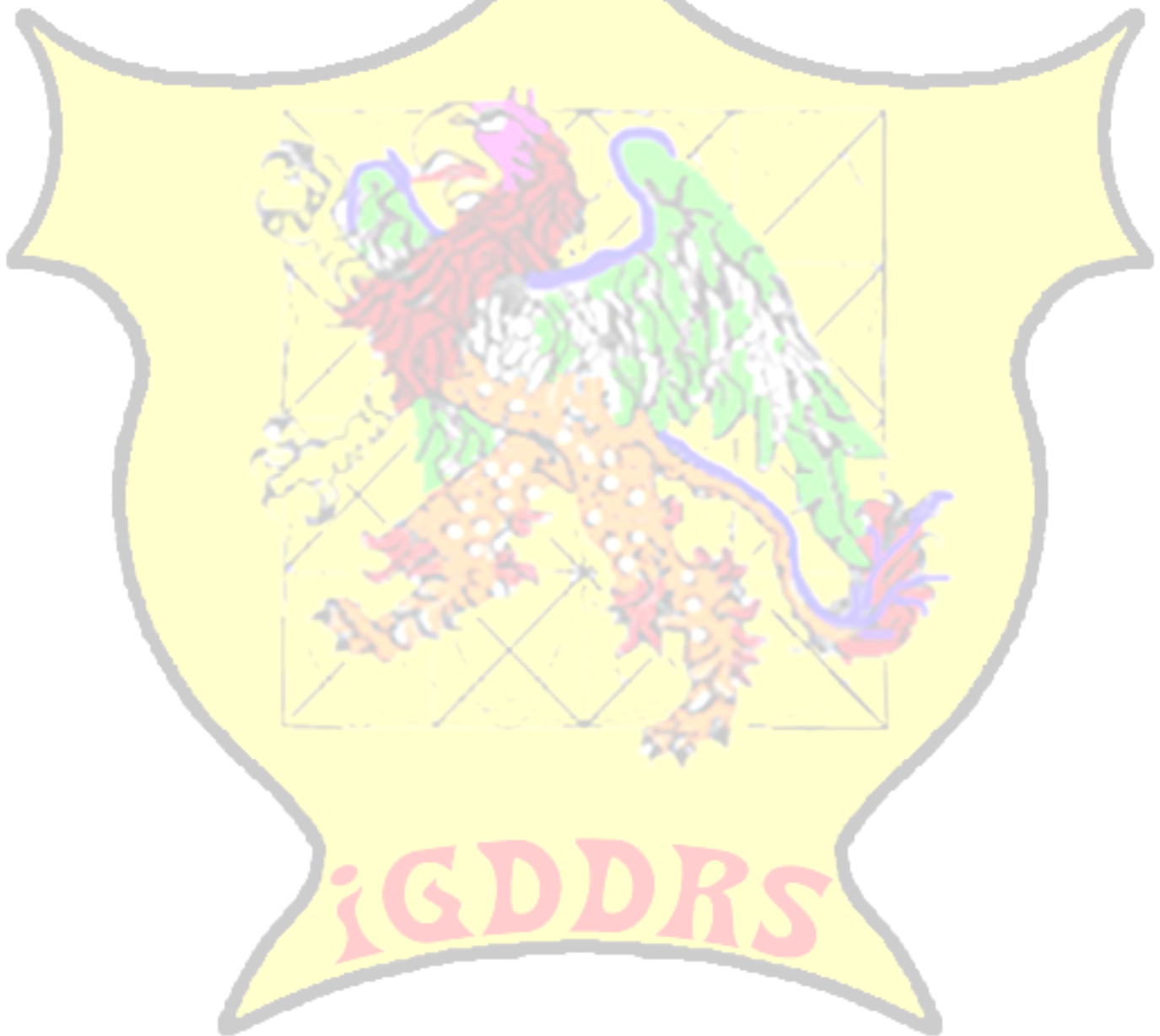
National Director-

Is appointed by the Technical Director to over see the Registration of Members, over see the Regional Directors of that nation, set forth Passage de Grades in the Nation and to review all material before the Technical Director, as that Nation grows in memberships that nation can have four Regional Directors under its Director thus those Regional Directors are appointed solely by the Technical Director, yet can vote in a National Director.

Regional Director-

Is appointed by the Technical Director every year, is responsible for registering the Members and over viewing of the members in each of the member salles of that region. The Regional Director can host seminars for the promotion and development of DDRS and awareness programs of the Guild such as women's perfect protection (sm).

Thus in hosting a seminar or demonstration the Regional Director can appoint a team or convey the assistance of the Technical Director.





**CHAPTER
TWO**

IGDDRS

1-OBLIGATIONS OF THE CLUBS, MEMBERS & FIGHTERS

1.1 Each club has to be a member of the International Guild of Danse De Rue Savate. They have to pick one of the following club membership statuses:

- Full Membership Fee \$ 1000.00 Per Year
- Associate Membership Fee \$ 600.00 Per Year
- Affiliate Membership Fee \$ 300.00 Per Year
- Sponsored Membership Fee \$ 000.00 Per Year

August 15th to July 31st of each year. LATE: AFTER SEPTEMBER 1st add \$300.00

1.2 All members TASBF&AS the dues are divided upon what there member club is. The dues are as follows:

- Full Membership Fee \$ 60.00 Per Year
- Associate Membership Fee \$ 80.00 Per Year
- Affiliate Membership Fee \$100.00 Per Year
- Independent Membership Fee \$175.00 Per Year
- Sponsored Membership Fee \$000.00 Per Year

August 15th to July 31st of each year. LATE: AFTER SEPTEMBER 1st add \$40.00

2-THE PASSPORT

- 2.1** The Passport has to be presented at all exams or fights for the participating member.
- 2.2** Loss of Passport: The member must send a letter of recommendation by a Moniteur to the Technical Director of the TASBF&AS, with a \$150.00 replacement fee.
- 2.3** If the passport is not presented at the beginning of an exam or fight, it will result in the member not participating or the members forfeiture of the fight.
- 2.4** If the passport is altered in any form other than official signatures, it will result in the members disbarment from the TASBF&AS.

3-MEMBERSHIPS AND PARTICIPATION

- 3.1** If a club is not affiliated to the Guild. The club can not teach or promote the Disciplines of the Danse De Rue Savate. The members of a non-affiliated club can not Participate, practice or take part in any sanctioned event of the International Guild of Danse De Rue Savate.
- 3.2** If a member is not affiliated with the Guild the member can not participate in any event, exam or practice in any of the clubs sanctioned by the Guild.

- 3.3** If a member or a club deviates from the regulations of the Guild it will result in the affiliated club or member to be barred from the TASBF&AS.
- a. disbarment of a club has to be brought to the attention of the Technical Director and he is the only one who can disbar a member or Resubmitted.
 - b. disbaring a member from the Guild has to be brought to the attention of the Technical Director and he is the only one who can disbar a member or resubmit a member.
- 3.4** If a member comes in from another Federation or Association into the Guild their Ranking will be inspected and examined
- A. Probation Status is a must 60 days for a technical grade, 90 days for an Instructional grade.
 - B. If a member refuses to take an exam, and then the process of debarment will resume.
 - C. If Member is not able to hold Ranking or pass the examination, the Guild will place member in an automatic probation of Six Months.

4-Definitions of Clubs, Schools or Academies

4.1 Definition of a club:

- A-a club can be run by an Initiateur, Aid-Moniteur, Moniteur or Professeur or a Coach with the privilege rights giving by the Technical director in Writing.
- B- A club is in an educational Facility.

4.2 Definition of a School:

- A. The main difference between a club and a school is that a Initiateur or above can hold a school and it has to be privately owned.

4.3 Definition of an Academy:

An Academy is owned and maintained by a Professeur, which has Coaches, Intiateurs Aide-Moniteurs and Moniteurs within its teaching Ranks.

4.5 Each of these facilities can exist with the Guild. Each is governed differently. Each of the classifications has different powers invested to them.

4.6 All of the teaching facilities of the Guild they are all called Salles or salle for Training Hall, Regardless of status. No salle can be opened within Five miles from another Salle.

Unless the salle is a Club.

- a. If a member disregards the above. The salle my be disbarred from the association.
- b. if the Salle continues then the members of that salle may be disbarred as well.
- c. If a salle is within the planning stages of opening. It has to be brought forth to the Guild, 8 weeks before opening. After its request, the Guild may or may not give its approval for opening. If the salle is not released for opening. The Member might request a reason for its denial.

4.7 Reasons why a member may not hold a salle.

Distrustful behavior, illegal business actions, in which case Article 3.3-b will be enforced.

5- Advertising & web sites

5.1- Any type of advertising has to be first approved by the Technical Director.

5.2- Any website of any member of the Guild must have the following meta tag format on its pages:

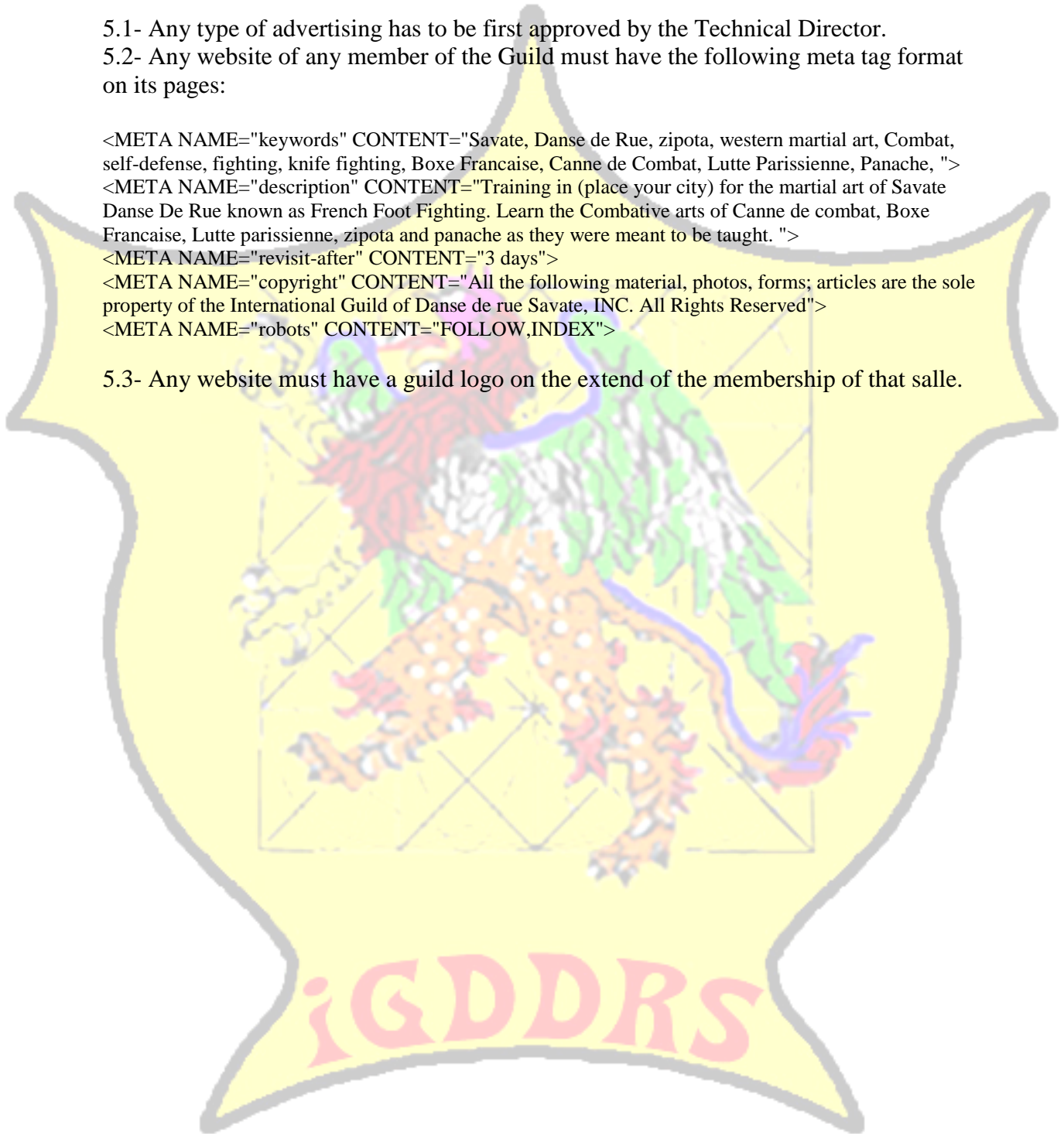

CHAPTER THREE



IGDDRS

1-RANKING OF BF SAVATE

1.1 The members can obtain certain ranking levels known as colored gloves. Given by examinations, known as Passage de Grades, the exam can be written and must show technical proficiency. If a higher technical grade is testing that member can be asked any technique or set up to the point of the rank that he or she is testing for.

a. Exams can and must be announced to the TASBF&AS; one month before the examination date.

b. Certain Exams will be given by the TASBF&AS at certain ranking levels.

1.2 The technical classification levels of BF SAVATE: (less than 17 years of age three levels of each glove), Once per year for those 18 and over.

- BLUE GLOVE
- GREEN GLOVE
- RED GLOVE
- WHITE GLOVE
- YELLOW GLOVE
- VIOLET GLOVE (under 17 only)
- SILVER GLOVE

1.3 Competition levels of BF SAVATE:

- BRONZE GLOVE

1.3 Instructional levels of the TASBF&AS:

- *COACH
- *INITIATEUR
- *AIDEMONITEUR
- *MONITEUR
- *PROFESSEUR
- *MAITRE

1.4 Levels of honor of the TASBF&AS:

- *VERMIEL GLOVE
- *GOLD GLOVE

1-1 Ranking of Savate

Changes to 1.1

c. If a member fails to participate in an exam, after signing the exam invitation. The Member will forfeit the exam fees.

d. If a member has a valid excuse then the exam fee will be credited to the next Examination. This excuse has to be written and sent to the Association at T.A.S.B.F. &A.S. 220Hillside Rd., Laredo Texas, 78041.

- e. If a member walks into an examination late the member will not present the examination, unless the member has a valid excuse.
- f. If a member misses two examinations which the member is presenting or habitual excuses are formed, the member will not partake in any examination for the following year.

Changes to 1.3 Instructional grades

1.3 (a) If a Coach, Initiateur & Aide-Moniteur leaves or stops training without a written leave of absence, the internship hours will be forfeited, and will also partake in the next exam.

2-PRESENTING RANK

2.1 A Savateur must wear his or her ranking at all time as well as when presenting an exam, Seminar, Demonstration or going for a match and must be worn on the left chest on the official uniform of SAVATE.

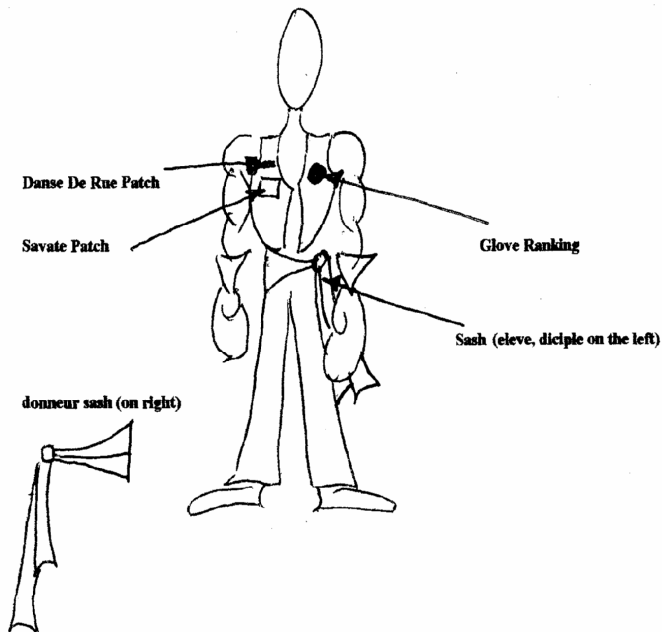
2.2 The uniform of Danse de Rue Savate is the official uniform that must be worn by all affiliate, associate and full members.

- A. Patches of the International Guild of Danse De Rue Savate go on the Right side of the Vest.
- B. The Glove Ranking goes on the Left side of the vest.
- C. The Colored Sash of an Eleve and Dicile status Savateur, is tied on the left, with black shirt for eleves, white shirts optional for disciples
- D. The Sash of a Donneur is tied on the Right side.

2.2 Drawing of uniform



2.3 Usage of a wrong rank or sash will place a Savateur in a Automatic Probation, if continuing the use of a wrong rank, The Savateur will be disbarred.

2.4 During the day of the Examination the member must have present with him a letter of acceptance from the Guild, in order to participate in the Exam. This form states the efforts and attitudes of the member. This letter is in reference to the training logs of each member of the Guild, This letter is sent to the members salle, and the Head instructor will hand deliver it to the member, prior to members examination.

2.5 Falsification of rank in literature or advertisements will place Savateur in Probation or unless proven otherwise.

2.6 Before each exam the member must have filled out the Passage de Grade invitation form and paid the test fees to the Guild, This has to be presented two weeks before the Examination, and send to the Guild by the members Instructor.

3-TECHNICAL GRADES CAN BE GIVEN WHEN AND BY WHOM

3.1 Ranking can only be given by a Professeur, Moniteur and Aide-Moniteur only during a Passage de Grade.

3.1 (a) the passage de grade needs to be set on the formal calendar 90 days before the date. A formal list of those testing must be sent to the Guild office 40 days prior to the date of the passage de Grade.

3.2 Gloves are given by an exam, only during the appropriate time for each Glove Has been obtained by the member.

3.3 The times of taking the exams for technical gloves:
Is one year between Glove Exams (For 17 and under divide by three for the time)

*BLUE GLOVE

*GREEN GLOVE

*RED GLOVE

} Wears an Black Sash

*WHITE GLOVE

*YELLOW GLOVE

*VIOLET GLOVE – Only given to members under the age of 18

*SILVER GLOVE Wears an Black and Blue Sash

3.4 165-hours must be earned per member if they want to present an exam during the passage de grade. If a member does not take an exam within the season, hours earned will be lost for the following season. So no accumulation of hours for any member.

3.4(A) Each Seminar hour counts for 3-hours

3.5 During the members training periods each month a form of performance has to be filled out by the head instructor of the member's salle.

a- The form covers the performance level and attendance of the member.

Examples of hours earned: if the member has a constant absence level the member will forfeit the time of experience needed for each glove level. Mr. John Smith has completed the blue glove and is training for his Green Glove. After the first month he stops for weeks, and starts again. The second start date will be credited for the training time.

b- This is to evaluate the instructor as well as to see the progress of the member.

c- This will aide in the performance of the students and instructors of the Guild.

Both the Instructor and the Member will sit and review the observations and comments written down. This will enable any questions to be reviewed at this time. This aids in the growth of the Student Instructor bonding and setting goals.

d- The forms will be send to the Guild by the Instructor each month on the fifth

Day to be filed in the members file, there are three copies members, instructors and the Guilds.

e- If the instructor is going to be late in sending the forms then he should contact the Secretary of the Guild.

4- COMPETITION GRADES CAN BE GIVEN WHEN AND BY WHOM

4.1 Competition grades are only given by the delegate official during the fight in which the fighter has obtained the necessary fights required for obtaining that rank.

4.2 Number of fights required in achieving the following competition gloves:
*BRONZE GLOVE after ten fights

5-INSTRUCTIONAL GRADES

5.1 Instructional grades are given after the member has completed the proper time and courses given by the TECHNICAL DIRECTOR. The Technical Director can issue any Instructional Grade as long as the member has been active and in true directions of the art. During the exam the Technical Director and two Witnesses. Definition of Federal Rank (Moniteur, Professeur, or Maitre)

5.1(a) Every Instructor Grade Recipient must make the Annual Instructors Gathering for them to be able to continue teaching the following season. If a member that has any teaching rank misses for any excuse then they will lose the teaching ability for one full season.

5.1(b) if a member wants to become any instructor he must do an instructor apprenticeship. The member must ask for a petition form and have three other instructor sign the form in or have a Maitre sign by his lonesome, order for the technical director to commence his schooling. Thus if accepted becomes a direct student to that Professeur when he becomes an apprentice.

5.2 Times which have to be obtained, for Examination of Instructional Grade a member must be active in years:

COACH- between the time the Professeur of the member, gives the member the proper education in becoming a coach. Wears an Orange Sash

INITIATEUR- after the member has obtained a white glove and is a coach. The Technical Director will give the member the proper classes and Federal Examination. Wears an Purple Sash

AIDE-MONITEUR- after the Initiateur Gives 200 hours of classes takes the proper classes under the Technical Director , and is a Silver Glove I and has taken the Federal Exam. Wears an Maroon Sash

MONITUER- after the AIDE-MONITUER has given 300 hours of class and is a silver Glove II and has taken all the requirements given to him by the Technical Director and has taken a Federal Exam. Wears a Black and Green Sash

PROFESSEUR- after the Moniteur has produced two Silver Gloves

Only the technical Director can give him the title of Professeur.

Wears a Black and Red Sash

MAITRE- Is an honorary Teaching Rank and is given to a Professeur after being a Professeur of the International Guild for more than 8 years. A Matire can solely produce a Silver Glove By himself with having just two witnesses, Wears a White and Red Sash

5.3- For any reason that the member as an apprentice stops his training of instructor or is told by his Professeur that he will no longer continue the apprenticeship road. He must withdraw from wearing the rank of that level of Instructorship. A meeting will be held by the Technical Director with the Professeur and follow the commands of that decision. The member if he had a salle that salle will seize all training until further notice from the Technical Director.

5.3(a)- Thus in this event the member will not be able to teach for a period of 60 days and can take an exam with the technical director for continuation and operation of the salle. If the member refuses then the procedure will follow as per **3.3**.

5.3(b)- If the member wishes to continue his training for Instructor status he must perform all the apprentice level tutelage fro the technical Director.

5.3- If a member joins from another Federation or Association the level of Member will drop automatically.

A. Technical Grades

Blue, Green, Red, White & Yellow Glove will stay but will be examined in 60 Days (Probation). If the member fails examination dropped two levels.

B. Silver Gloves will be placed in 90 days probation and an examination will be Given if the member fails then he will be de-ranked to Red Glove

C. Instructor level will Drop automatically in this order.

Coach & Initiateur to none

Aide- Moniteur to Coach

Moniteur to Initiateur

Professeur to Aide-Moniteur

and Placed on Probation for Six months then given proper Examination according to order of above.

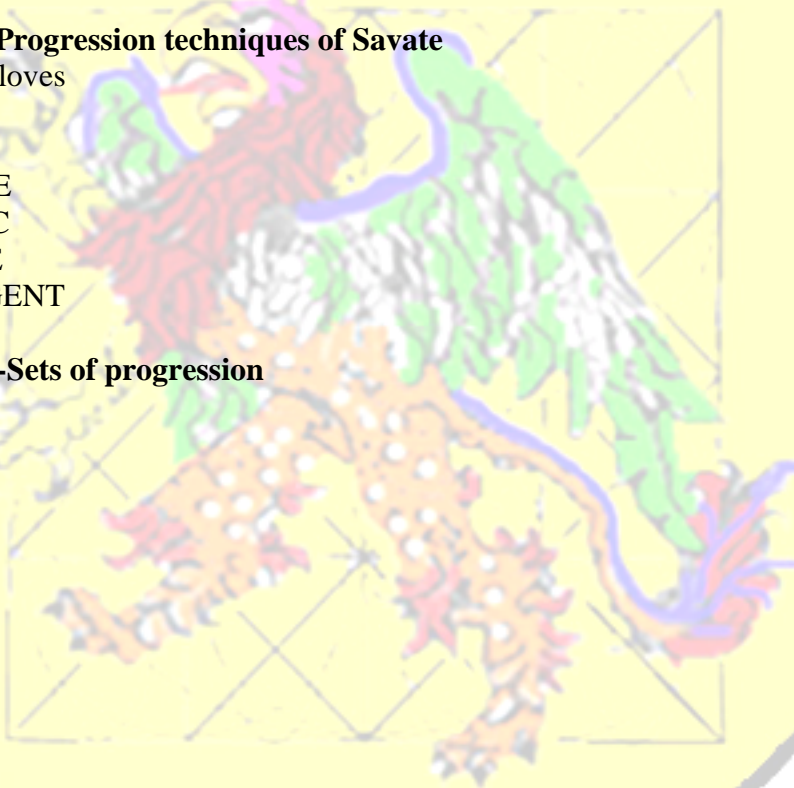

ARTICLE I

THE RANKING OF DANSE DE RUE SAVATE

1-PREAMBLE:

1.1-The techniques and ranking of Savate are divided by eight degrees which have to be obtained in a succession:

- 1-Blue Glove/Gant Bleu
- 2-Green Glove/Gant Vert
- 3-Red Glove/Gant Rouge
- 4-White Glove/Gant Blanc
- 5-Yellow Glove/Gant Jaune
- 6-Silver Glove I/Gant Argent I
- 7-Silver Glove II/ Gant Argent II
- 8-Gant Argent II/ Gant Argent III

2-DELIVERANCE OF TECHNICAL GRADES

2.1-Colored Gloves

The colored gloves are given by the Professeur or Moniteur of a club.

-The ranking is done by the period of initiation of the member.

-A member can start competitions after Red Glove, only for Ranking Statis {competitive}. If the Professeur & Moniteur agrees that the student has technical abilities he can write a letter to the Technical Director.

2.2-Silver Glove I

The Exams are given by Federal Jury meaning Three Professeurs are able to give the Exam.

2.2(a) Only the technical Director can give a Silver Glove II

2.2(b) Only the Paul-Raymond Buitron III can give a Silver Glove III

3-SHOWING RANK

RANK HAS TO BE WORN ON THE TENUE ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE CHEST ALONG WITH PROPER SASH. DURING EXAMS, SEMINARS, DEMONSTRATIONS OR BOUTS.

4-PROBATIONS

4.1-Type 1 Probation: May be given by a members instructor if the member has show Lack of Respect to himself peers, school or Danse De Rue Savate. It has to be addressed to the guild in writing for the Instructor, showing the reasons for the Probation, after the written letter the Guild will send a formal letter to the member. Probation of this sort may not exceed 60 days.

4.2- Type 2 Probation: This probation is only given by the Technical Director to the Association/Guild. This may be given for the lack of respect a member has show towards the guild. It may also be given to the Eleve/Student, Dicile/Disicile Savateur which has shown lack of promotion of savate, respect or no control, may also be given to an Instructor which has not finished the required time for his next exam.

Example: a couch stopping their internship with out a valid written excuse. In cases like this a coach will be set on 90 day probation.

4.3- Failure to abide or follow probation may result in disbarment by the Guild.

ARTICLE II

PROGRESSION OF THE TECHNIQUES OF DANSE DE RUE: SAVATE

1-The Colored Gloves

1.1-Preamble

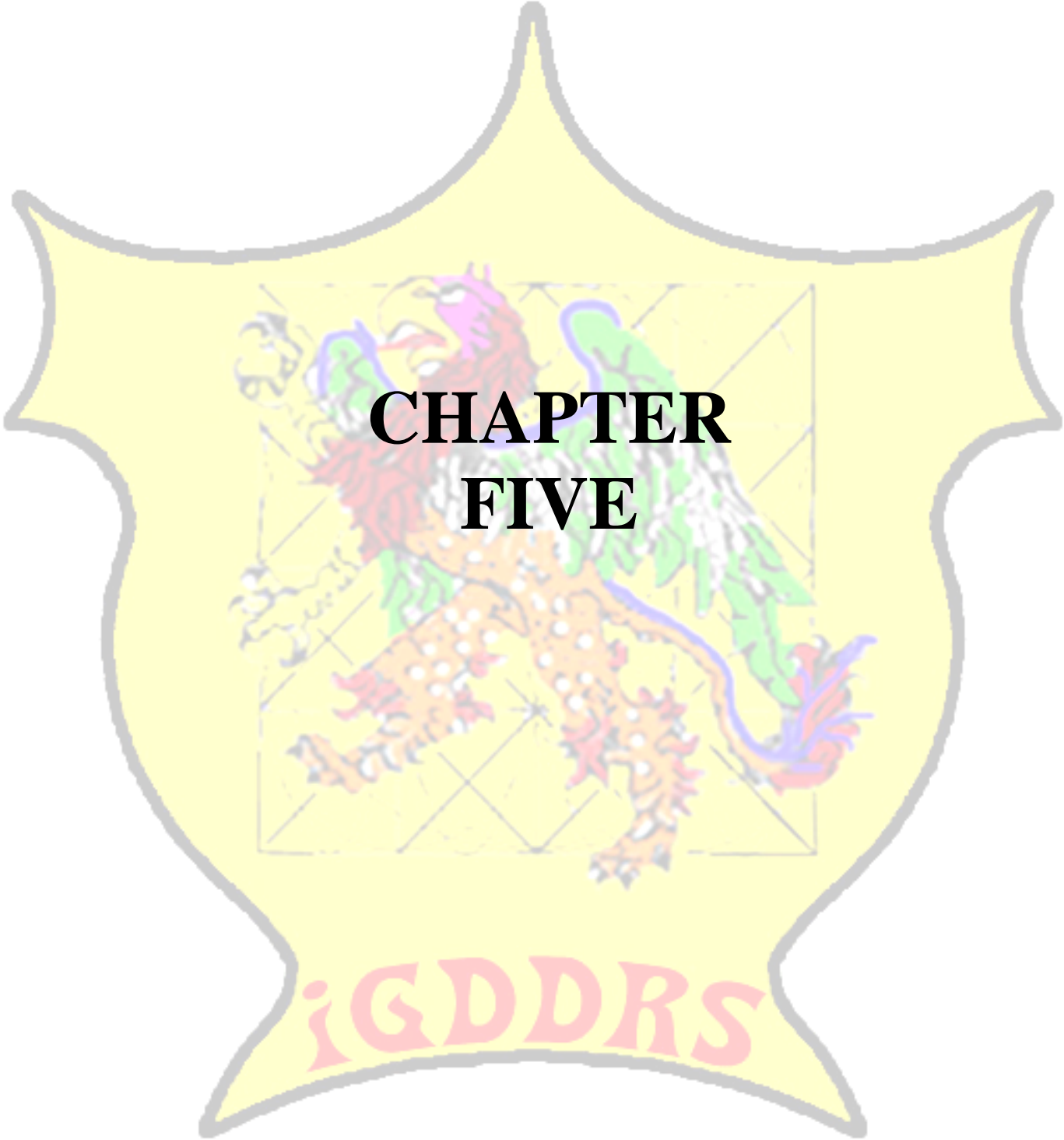
- Blue Glove: execution of the fundamental techniques
- Green Glove: able to have coordination when performing the techniques
- Red Glove: being dynamic, flowing with the movements
- White Glove: maintaining the distance of the punches and kicks
- Yellow Glove: keeping your head or mind clam while under pressure

2-Remarks of examinations

- all of the exams have to be given under a certain distance and with the same level of experience, it is possible to give and take an exam with a partner that has a higher level than you.
- Failure to show for an exam, member must send a written excuse to the Guild, exam fees will not be refunded.
- showing up late for an exam will forfeit the exam with or without a valid explanation

ARTICLE I: Status of Eleve/Student

An Eleve/Student is one who trains for the acknowledgments of the techniques and theories of Danse De Rue Savate,

They carry a Black Sash and glove rankings. Which are Blue, Green , Red, White Yellow Gloves

An Eleve should be respectful dedicated and train with all enthusiasm of training under instructor of the guild.

Respect is the fullest of the virtues that Donneurs teach Eleves. As well as theories and techniques are pass in this level.

As an Eleve one should address the higher Ranks by their status Example if a coach is present , then one should address the coach as Coach and not : hey pal.

If addressing a peer he should be respectful and never disrespectful.

One should look proper and train for the goals in learning Savate and never any horseplaying when training.

One should also have the respect for all the salles under the Guild.

One should never challenge anyone, since it will be taken seriously.

An Eleve should follow the rules and regulations of the Guild.

Article II Section B: Respect of Grades

The Levels of this Category: Coach, Initiateur, Aid-Moniteur are higher than Eleve Gloves and must always be respected.

If a Silver glove is present he allows with respect the coach to teach even though he might have a higher technical glove level.

Technical levels and Teaching levels are different.

Examples of respect:

If you have a red glove in the class and a coach is a green glove, the higher ranked is the Coach.

If you have a red glove coach and a yellow glove coach the higher rank is the Yellow glove coach who should lead the class.

Respect will be highly regularized.

Silver Glove

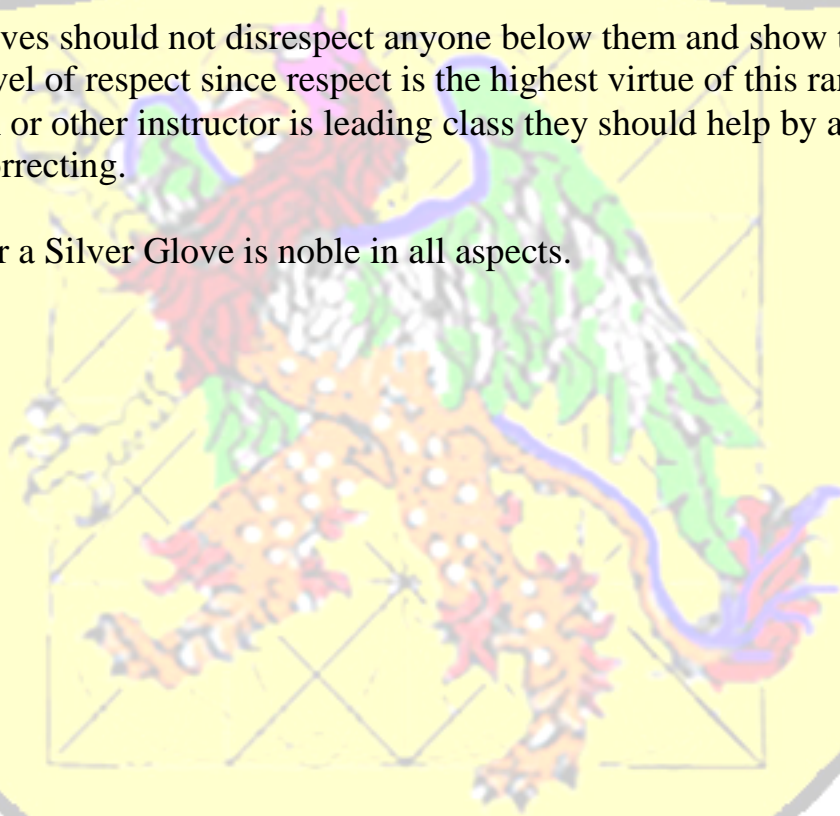
A Silver Glove is a disciple without the ability to give rank or teach class.

Respect and attitude should always be acknowledged.

Egos against others will be taken seriously.

Silver Gloves should not disrespect anyone below them and show the highest level of respect since respect is the highest virtue of this rank. If a Coach or other instructor is leading class they should help by assisting and not correcting.

Remember a Silver Glove is noble in all aspects.

Article II Section C: Responsibilities and Requirements

These requirements are understood that a Disciple has the level already and are looking forward on the levels.

Coaches:

Attitude of a Coach:

- Must assist in class demonstrations of techniques and should not wonder and help
- Instead they should be role models
- Never speaking to a student or demonstrating while in class , and under higher Ranks.
- Note: this behavior will be noticed quickly and frowned upon heavily.

Requirements for next level Initiateur,

- 200 hours of Internship assisting and teaching -a minimum of two 1 hour classes per
- week (not accepted his own learning classes)
- Sets for Initiateur as well as the requirements for the Exam.
- Must attend Disciple seminars and workshops.

iGDDRS

Initiateur

Attitude:

- Building a class with his own promotions and dedication. Meaning the promotion comes from the initiateur.
- Wondering in class should be brief when asked upon by a higher rank or when teaching own class.
- When teaching emotions should be left outside and direction of teaching should be first.
- Avoid when correcting, to hover over a Student/Elève. This may scare or get one nervous and eventually leading to discouragement of Elève.
- Making verbal corrections should be quick and quickly moving on.
- Always support the Guild and its efforts if changes or challenges arise.

Requirements:

- Sets for Aide-Moniteur level must be learned,
- Should lead his own class. With a 200 hour internship of teaching by themselves is need for the next Level,
- A Initiateur might receive some compensation if a school permits. But it is not a requirement. If the School is in good standing financially than compensation should be given. Remember that you are still in an apprenticeship and should be grateful in that..

iGDDRS

Aide Moniteur

Attitude:

- You might be asked to leave and start your own class , by the Guild. When you reach this level. If you accept then you will be responsible for its growth.
- If you go and start you own club without asking then you will be placed on Probation.
- In this level you are now ready to give Eleves ranking. This should not be abused as this goes against the regulations of the guild.

Requirements:

- 200hrs of teaching and having a Silver Glove as well as the requirements for the Exam, which is needed, will give you the right to take the exam of Moniteur.
- Without being a Silver Glove, you will not be allowed to test for the next higher level.

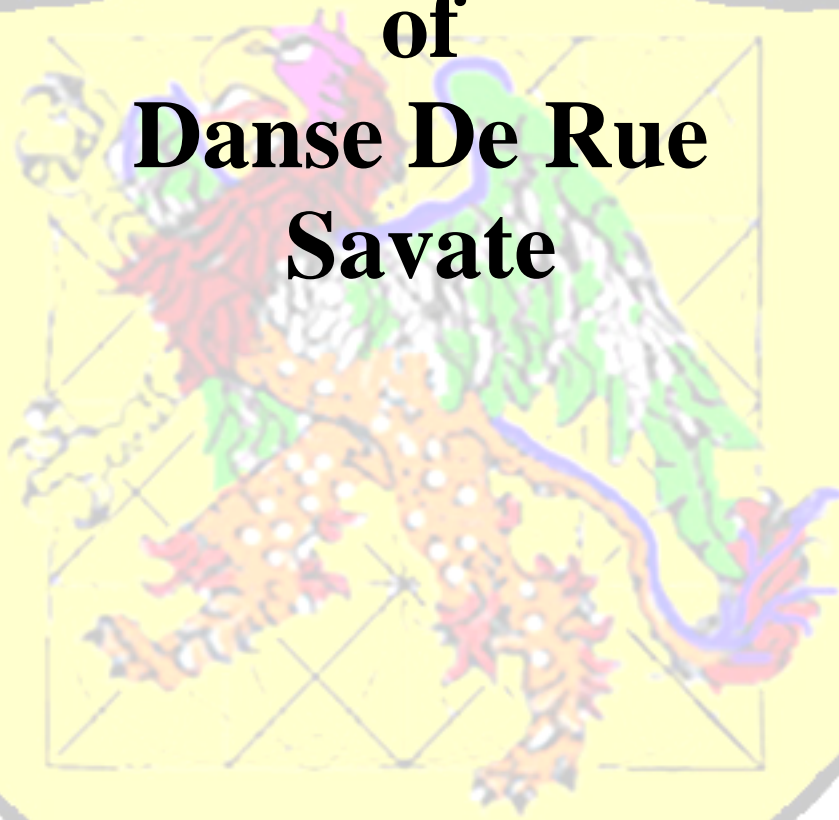
